### The future of the American antiwar movement, and why we should care, presented by Justin Raimondo

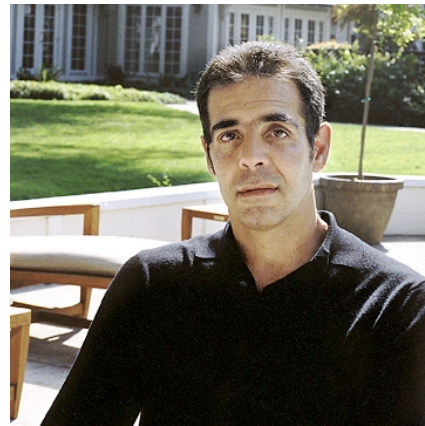
